

STADIUM REGULATIONS for Stadion Letzigrund

As of 2 June 2025

1. Purpose and Scope

- 1 These stadium regulations set out the rules of conduct for the use of Stadion Letzigrund.
- 2 They apply to the entire enclosed stadium grounds, encompassing the areas designated on a separate site plan. The site plan is published online together with these stadium regulations.

2. Objective of the Stadium Regulations

- 3 The purpose of these regulations is to prevent harm to persons and property, protect the stadium from contamination, and ensure the smooth and safe conduct of events and training activities.

3. Access and Presence on the Grounds

- 4 During events, only persons in possession of a valid ticket or other form of entry authorization (e.g., accreditation), or who can otherwise prove their right of access for the event, may enter the stadium grounds.
- 5 Outside of events, public access is permitted only in areas designated as publicly accessible. Access to non-public areas requires special authorization.
- 6 Driving and parking within the stadium grounds is only permitted with a special access pass. Applicable restrictions must be observed. The public underground car park is exempt, except that during events, it may only be used with specific access permits.

4. Entrance Controls and Security Checks During Events

- 7 During events, visitors are required, upon entering the grounds, to present their entry authorization to security personnel without being asked and to hand it over for verification upon request. The validity and use of tickets are governed by the respective event organizers.
- 8 Persons unable to present valid entry authorization, subject to a stadium ban, or posing a security risk will be denied entry or removed from the stadium grounds.

5. Conduct on the Grounds

- 9 All persons on the stadium grounds must behave in a manner that does not harm, endanger, harass, or unnecessarily obstruct others.

- 10 All persons on the grounds must comply with instructions issued by the police, fire department, security, order and rescue services, and stadium announcers. Intentional or negligent non-compliance may result in removal from the grounds by security personnel or police.
- 11 All entrances, exits, and emergency, escape, and rescue routes must be kept clear. Beyond these regulations, additional requirements may be imposed in individual cases to prevent or eliminate risks to life, health, or property. Instructions issued for this purpose by the police or security personnel must be followed.
- 12 During events, all visitors must occupy the seat assigned to them and indicated on their ticket and may only use the designated access routes to reach it. For safety reasons and to prevent hazards, visitors must comply with instructions from the police or security personnel, which may require them to occupy seats other than those indicated on their ticket, even in different sections.

6. Prohibitions

- 13 The following are prohibited on the stadium grounds:
 - a) Endangering or disturbing public safety and order;
 - b) Harassing, frightening, or endangering others;
 - c) Misusing alarms, emergency calls, or distress signals;
 - d) Damaging or contaminating the stadium or grounds;
 - e) Committing acts offensive to public decency;
 - f) Entering non-public areas without authorization;
 - g) Carrying objects whose possession or transport is illegal;
 - h) Carrying weapons or objects that can be used as weapons (e.g., firearms, knives, brass knuckles, baseball bats, laser pointers);
 - i) Carrying items with violent or aggressive messages;
 - j) Starting fires, using fireworks, flares, smoke powder, smoke bombs, or other pyrotechnic devices;
 - k) Masking one's identity within the stadium;
 - l) Climbing on facades, fences, walls, barriers, lighting installations, camera platforms, trees, poles, roofs, or similar structures;
 - m) Writing, painting, or affixing objects on buildings, installations, or paths
 - n) Using the grounds as a toilet outside of designated facilities or littering;
 - o) Blocking or obstructing traffic areas, pathways, access and egress routes to spectator seating, or emergency routes
 - p) Standing on seats in spectator areas;
 - q) Using skateboards, inline skates, bicycles, etc., or bringing animals (except guide dogs);
 - r) Entering the playing field or athletics facilities without explicit permission;
 - s) Smoking in enclosed spaces, including underground car parks and restrooms (smoking is only permitted outdoors);
 - t) Undertaking any advertising, decorations, or placing objects on the grounds;
 - u) Promoting or selling goods, distributing printed materials, conducting collections, or setting up booths or stalls. Catering of guests is permitted only by service providers appointed by the stadium operator (City Sports Office Zurich) or the event organizer;
 - v) Collecting, transmitting, reproducing, or distributing information or data on match progress, behavior, or other aspects of events, or recording audio, video, or audiovisual

material of an event for betting, gambling, or commercial purposes not previously authorized, unless expressly approved by the league and club. Mobile phones may only be used for personal, private purposes.

- 14 Additional prohibitions may be imposed by the event organizer during events.

7. Violations

- 15 Violations of these stadium regulations, especially behavior endangering safety, entitle security personnel to remove the persons responsible from the stadium or grounds.
- 16 Persons who violate these regulations or otherwise endanger safety may be banned from Stadion Letzigrund, Zurich.
- 17 Claims for damages and the filing of reports for criminal or administrative offenses remain reserved.

8. Final Provisions

- 18 These stadium regulations come into effect on 2 June 2025.
